

These refugee students are used to overcoming the greatest obstacles in life and they took on the challenges of living through a pandemic with the same attitude that has gotten them through the hardships of refugee life. They persisted through lockdowns, online learning and deferred internships. We are happy to report that they completed their technical exams this month, started their internships, and are right on track to start their second term this fall.


\$5,000 for scholarships. As part of the project, the Loyola students interviewed our cohort in Nairobi.

Women's Vocational Program

Together with our community partner Windle International Kenya we will offer scholarships to young refugee women starting this fall. Windle conducted surveys, refugee women participated, and we listened. Three professional degree programs were identified as areas of strong interest by the women.

Windle staff evaluated courses in Nairobi and selected Kenya Medical College and Kenyatta University programs in Midwifery, Nutritional Counseling, and

Psychosocial Counselling.
